From The Editor

I was livid. Not just heartbroken. Not just stunned. I was righteously angry when I got the news that Charlie Kirk had been assassinated on a college campus in broad daylight. A sniper's bullet ended the life of a man who stood for truth, for youth, and for the values that built this nation. And while the media scrambled to spin the story, I saw it for what it was: evil, unjustified, and the latest fruit of a radical leftist culture that has lost its soul.

Charlie Kirk wasn't just a conservative. He was a voice for the voiceless, a defender of biblical values in hostile territory. He was murdered while doing what he always did - engaging students, challenging ideas, and calling America back to sanity. And what did the left do? Some literally celebrated. Some mocked. Some justified. That's not political disagreement. That's pure evil and spiritual depravity.

This wasn't just a tragedy. It was a symptom of a deeper sickness. The radical left has become unhinged. Since President Trump returned to office earlier this year, we've seen an explosion of rage, riots, and rhetoric that drips with hatred. College campuses have become war zones. Streets have turned into battlegrounds. And Christians, conservatives, and patriots are the targets.

Let's not pretend this is new. The seeds of this chaos were sown years ago. Remember these quotes?

Maxine Waters (D-CA): "If you see anybody from that Cabinet in a restaurant, in a department store, at a gasoline station, you get out and you create a crowd...you tell them they're not welcome anymore, anywhere." (June 2018)

Kamala Harris (then-Senator): "They're not going to stop... and they should not." - speaking about BLM protests, some of which turned violent (June 2020)

Chuck Schumer (D-NY): "I want to tell you, Gorsuch... Kavanaugh... You have released the whirlwind and you will pay the price." (March 2020)

These aren't fringe activists. These are elected officials inciting confrontation, stoking division, and normalizing hostility toward anyone who dares to stand for biblical truth or constitutional values.

And now, we've buried Charlie Kirk.

The Word of God is not silent about lawlessness and chaos. In fact, it warns us: "For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work..." (2 Thessalonians 2:7) "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil..." (Isaiah 5:20) "In the last days... people will be lovers of themselves... abusive, disobedient... without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good..." (2 Timothy 3:1–3)

This is not just political. It's spiritual warfare. The kingdom of darkness thrives on confusion, rebellion, and violence. And we're seeing it manifest in real time.

What Do We Do? We don't retreat. We don't cower. We stand.

Pray with fire - not passive prayers, but intercession that bombards heaven and shakes the gates of hell. Speak boldly. Use your platform. Write. Sing. Preach. Post. Don't let the mob silence you. Truth must be louder than lies. Support righteous leaders. Get behind those who defend life, liberty, and biblical values. Vote. Volunteer. Show up.

The battle is fiercest on college campuses. Equip your children with discernment. Challenge curriculum. Support ministries like Turning Point USA.

Call out evil! Don't sugarcoat it. Murder is evil. Lawlessness is evil. Hatred is evil. And silence is complicity.

Charlie Kirk's death must not be in vain. It should be a wake-up call. This is the moment we say, "Enough." The left has weaponized culture, corrupted institutions, and unleashed chaos. But we serve a God who is not mocked. Judgment IS coming. And revival IS rising.

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5) Let's be that light. Let's be the remnant. Let's be the voice that refuses to bow. God's got an army!!!





The Power of Truth: Oath-Keeping in the Life of a Believer

gain, ye have heard that it hath been said of these laws lies humanity's tendency toward dishonesty. by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear Since Moses' time, lying has been an ongoing problem thine oaths: But I say unto you, Swear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne: Nor by the earth; for it is his footstool: neither by Jerusalem; for it is the city of the great King. Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, because thou canst not make one hair white or black. But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil." - Matthew 5:33-37

Have you ever made hasty statements, immediately regretted them, or made promises you couldn't keep? No one is immune; words can have powerful impacts. Words can build or shatter trust instantly. Matthew 5:33-37 depicts Jesus turning His attention away from our relationships to something even more intimate: our integrity. Previously, He addressed topics like anger, lust, marriage, and revenge; now He shifts His focus toward character truthfulness, urging His followers toward an "improved righteousness," one not simply limited to external acts but that considers internal motivations behind them.

Some might question why discussing oath-keeping is even necessary; after all, aren't oaths just formalities? However, Christians know that each word we say matters because it reflects who we are as individuals and can effectively influence others. The Old Testament allowed oath-taking to establish the truthfulness of statements, yet by Jesus' time, people had corrupted this practice into an elaborate system of acceptable and unacceptable oaths that utilized loopholes to avoid accountability; rather than honoring truth, they made taking an oath a game of deceitful promises.

Jesus addressed this issue directly, teaching that honesty should be part of life for citizens of His kingdom. Our words should be trusted without needing elaborate promises since truthfulness isn't just something we say but who we are as well.

The Tradition of Keeping Oaths: Understanding **Historical Context**

Oath-taking has long been an essential aspect of society, providing trust and accountability between individuals. Biblical times highlighted this principle so heavily that many laws were written focusing on honoring one's promises (Ex. 20:7, Lev. 19:12, Num. 30:2, Deut. 23:21).

Jesus taught about keeping our word through Matthew 5:33-37 without directly quoting any particular Mosaic law but effectively summarized their essence: truthfulness and integrity when making promises or declarations. At the core

thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord that causes chaos in daily life and renders trust impossible for people who make promises they never mean to keep. It is nearly impossible to distinguish between real commitments and empty talk.

> Oath-taking was often employed in ancient societies as a safeguard against deceitful behavior. People would invoke the name of a deity to pledge their honesty, often adding solemn warnings such as, "May this god strike me down if I am lying." For Israelites, including invoking God as part of an oath carried considerable weight - it represented Him standing witness to promises made. Unfortunately, over time, people began using God's name even when breaking it violating both principles of honesty while also disgracing God's name itself from reality and manipulations that could take place under false oaths made.



The laws concerning oaths were never intended to promote casual or frequent vow-taking; instead, they sought to reduce reckless oath-making by invoking God more solemnly and with greater reverence. Oaths were only to be taken on matters of great significance, such as national or personal security issues that required binding declaration. They reminded Israelites that every action, promise, or word had a spiritual weight that reinforced accountability before God for their integrity - the primary aim was preventing false swearing, perjury, and casual making or breaking of vows.

The Pharisees' Distorted View of Oaths

Like so much of their legal system, the Pharisees reduced oath-keeping to a legalistic system that left loopholes rather than encouraging true integrity. Their focus remained more on meeting external requirements of law than on

understanding its moral or spiritual intent; so long as they technicalities - completely missing God's commands could convince themselves they were fulfilling it technically, they saw no problem manipulating it for personal gain. Legalistic mindsets led Pharisees to create a complex which weren't. Their intricate distinctions included declaring that an oath taken against the temple itself wasn't binding, but one taken against its gold was.

Furthermore, an oath taken against an altar itself wasn't considered obligatory, and taking an oath against any gifts brought before an altar could make dishonesty seem legitimately religious observance. All this gave rise to complicated interpretations, enabling them to justify dishonesty under the cover of religious observance, thus justifying dishonesty under religious pretenses.

Religious leaders effectively created a system that allowed deception by redefining which oaths were to be honored and which could be disregarded. Ignoring honesty as the basis for taking an oath, they turned it into a game of

regarding truthfulness, emphasizing that a person's word should always be reliable even without an oath to support it.

Jesus would later expose this hypocrisy in Matthew framework of rules regarding which oaths were binding and 23:16-22, calling out Pharisees for their bizarre distinctions regarding oaths. His remarks showed how their system was not only dishonest but fundamentally misguided. Rather than adhering to God's law, they had created a means to look righteous while engaging in deceitful practices.

The Heart of an Issue

At its core, Israel's problem was not simply its misuse of oaths but its lack of personal integrity. God had called them to be His holy people and reflect His truth and righteousness in everything they did. Yet too many had reduced moral obligations to legalistic rituals instead of living truthfully and honestly.

At just five years old, Loretta Jent sang her first notes in church - notes that would echo far beyond her hometown and into the hearts of listeners across the country. Today, she's a Christian music artist whose voice carries the weight of testimony, the warmth of Southern Gospel, and the healing power of grace.



"God Sees What's Hidden" Loretta Jent's Journey from the Backwoods to the Altar

Grew up in the backwoods of Carbon Hill,"
Loretta shares. "My love for music and ministry began early in life, and both are rooted in my deep faith and love for the Lord." That foundation, laid by her mother's unwavering prayers and spiritual strength, shaped Loretta's calling. "Mama taught me how to stand strong in the Lord. No matter what, never lose faith."

Loretta's musical style is a heartfelt blend of Southern Gospel, Christian Country, and Inspirational Christian music. Influenced by legends like The McKameys and Loretta Lynn, she's carved out a sound that's both down-home and divine. "I've always loved Southern Gospel and Country music," she says. "Over the years, I've blended those influences into a style that feels like home to me - down-to-earth, honest, and Spirit-filled."

Her journey hasn't been without hardship. Loretta has faced battles with fear, anxiety, and a health scare that brought

discovered a lump and was gripped by fear. "The ole tempter filled me with lies that I would die soon just like my mama did," she recalls. But God met her in the middle of her storm.

"Around a week before my appointment, a precious friend asked me to go to revival with her," Loretta recounts. "A lady I'd never met came to me and said, 'Can I pray with you?' I said, 'Please do.' She said, 'Honey, I'm not sure what is going on, but God said to tell you it's going to be okay." Days later, the doctor echoed those exact words: "Go home and have a good weekend. Everything is going to be okay." Loretta was overwhelmed with praise. "God is so, so good!"

That moment became a spiritual milestone, echoing another life-changing night when Loretta surrendered her heart to Christ. "The burdens of guilt and embarrassment were gone!" she says. "Praise God, the night I let go of that church pew and walked the walk that would forever change my course! I'm about to shout right now just thinking about it!"

Her testimony is woven into every lyric. Songs like I back painful memories of her mother's passing from Can't Help But Lift My Hands, If I Cross Your Mind, God metastatic breast cancer at just 48 years old. In 2021, Loretta Didn't Say a Thing, and Devil, Get Out of My Holler have

resonated with listeners across the country. "Every time someone tells me they were uplifted by a song or when someone comes up and says, 'Please pray with me. I needed that song today,' sheww wee, that goes all over me," Loretta says. "God is so good. I'm reminded that God's using even my weakest moments for His glory."

Her music has earned recognition on Christian Country and Gospel radio, and in June 2025, Loretta was nominated for the Fans Choice category at the Josie Music Awards. Just recently, she received another nomination from the WVIU Radio Music Awards. "It has been by the grace and goodness of God," she says humbly.

Her upcoming single, *Lord Are You Busy*, co-written with Gerald Crabb, is a poignant conversation with God - a reminder that even in silence, He's listening. "What a message there is in this conversation song!" Loretta says. "It's for the one who feels forgotten. God sees what's hidden."

That theme - being seen by God - is central to Loretta's ministry. "There were times when I felt invisible," she admits. "But God reminded me I was never forgotten. God uses the overlooked and the broken. He alone sees what we try to hide,



but yet He still chooses us! He chooses to love us."

Whether she's singing in a small church or preparing to walk on stage at a major event, Loretta remains grounded in her mission: to edify Jesus, bring hope to the hurting, and remind the broken that they are seen and loved. "We live in a time where many are searching for truth and identity," she says. "People are continually searching for something. It's a void that can't be filled until you ask Jesus to come into your heart."


At a typical concert or event, fans can expect heartfelt worship, uplifting songs, and a message that points straight to the cross. "I want every person to leave feeling refreshed, encouraged, and drawn closer to God," Loretta says.

"Helping others is what I truly want to do. We are called to serve."

From the backwoods of Alabama to the airwaves of Christian radio, Loretta Jent's journey is a living testimony of faith, perseverance, and purpose. 


> I will close with the chorus of a beautiful song, Thank You Lord For Your Blessings On Me...

Faith, family, perseverance, and music - these are the cornerstones of Jennifer Harris Gray's life and ministry. In a world that often feels divided and discouraged, her story shines as a reminder of what traditional American values, rooted in God's truth, can accomplish. She is living proof that no matter how many times life knocks you down, with faith and determination, you can rise again.

"God never left me, even when I felt broken. He sustained me when I couldn't sustain myself." - Jennifer Harris Gray

When Jennifer Harris Gray steps onto a stage - whether it's in a church, a bar, or at a bustling festival - her mission is the same: to bring light, faith, and encouragement to anyone willing to listen. She calls herself a "Soul Seeker," and through every note she sings, she shares not just music, but a testimony of resilience, redemption, and unwavering faith. "I'm not looking for fame, I'm looking for purpose. If God can use me to touch even one person, that's success."

Rising from the Fog

Jennifer's story is not one of smooth paths or easy triumphs. In 2006, her life changed dramatically after a car accident left her battling health challenges, brain fog, and deep depression. For years, she describes feeling lost in a fog - physically present but struggling to hold onto her identity, her music, and her purpose. "I felt like I had lost myself after the accident, but God reminded me that He still had work for me to do." Through prayer, perseverance, and faith in God's promises, she slowly rebuilt her life.

"Too late is in the grave. As long as I have breath, I can keep going."

A Vessel of Mercy

That sustaining grace is now woven into every song she sings. With her new music just released, Jennifer is stepping boldly into the next chapter of her calling. Her new album includes songs like *A Vessel of Mercy* and *Living Epistle*, which embody her conviction that God's mercy transforms brokenness into purpose. "Almost every time I sing, someone will come up to me afterward with tears in their eyes, asking for prayer. That's when I know I'm right where God wants me."

She writes much of her music through prayer, journaling, and reflection on scripture. "Some of my songs came straight out of nights spent reading my Bible and crying out to God," she shares. "They're not just lyrics - they're prayers set to music."

Singing Beyond the Walls

Jennifer's journey into music began in her twenties, singing in church choirs and later traveling internationally as part of evangelistic outreaches. From revival tents in California to Gospel stages in Africa, she discovered that her voice could touch hearts across cultures and backgrounds. She has sung for dignitaries, ministered through music in the Bahamas and Canada, and spent countless nights in tent meetings across the United States.

Yet what makes Jennifer unique in today's Christian Country and Inspirational music scene is her willingness to step outside traditional venues. She brings the Gospel into unexpected places - bars, festivals, community gatherings - believing that God's light shines brightest where it's least expected. "Some people may never set foot inside a church, but they'll sit and listen to a song. That's where God can meet them. If you let me come sing what I want to sing, I'll do it. And almost every time, someone will come to me crying, saying that my song touched them. That's worth it."

Resilience Shaped by Faith

Her courage to sing in unconventional settings has at times drawn criticism from religious circles, but Jennifer embraces her role as a bridge-builder. She says, "Jesus never condemned people - He met them where they were. That's what I want to do."

Behind her voice is a woman shaped by resilience. Jennifer's childhood demanded independence and perseverance, her adulthood brought trials of illness and loss, but through it all, she's held onto a deep childlike trust in God.

"My confidence was born out of desperation - it was either sink or swim. But when I gave my life to Christ in my twenties, that's when I really found my true voice."

She credits her family as a foundation of support, especially her husband who stood faithfully beside her during the hardest seasons. "He prayed with me, encouraged me, and reminded me that I was not forgotten," she says. "Family is everything to me."

Guided by Mentors and Family

Along the way, mentors and family members poured into her life, teaching her to believe in herself, to give generously, and to live with hope. One of her guiding lessons came from her mother-in-law: "You can't out give God." Jennifer carries that forward with gratitude, now using her music to uplift others.

She also remembers the encouragement of successful role models she met as a young woman - business leaders, teachers, and musicians - who showed her that faith, perseverance, and integrity could open doors she had once thought closed. She grew up listening to Gospel, Bluegrass, and Country music, and those influences shaped her unique sound. "I grew up listening to music that told a story. 

A Voice Forged in Faith, Fueled by Grace

For Allen Baker, Southern Gospel music isn't just a sound, it's a lifeline. From the pews of his childhood church in Atlanta to the spotlight of the NQC Showcase stage, Baker's journey has been marked by praise, pain, perseverance, and the unmistakable hand of God.

"I started singing in church when I was five years old," Baker recalls. "I didn't know then what the Lord had planned, but I knew I loved to sing, and I loved Him."

at his home church. Two years later, his family moved to Jasper, Georgia, his mother's hometown, where he graduated from Pickens High School in 1980. It was during those formative years that Baker's love for Southern Gospel took root.

"My mom and dad used to take me to the all-night singings in Atlanta," he says. "I got to see The Inspirations, The Happy Goodmans, The Kingsmen, The Florida Boys some of the best to ever do it. I fell in love with this music, especially The Inspirations. Their sound, their spirit, it just grabbed me."

Baker played trumpet in the high school marching band, but it was the Gospel stage that called him. He began singing with local groups across Jasper, Calhoun, and Rome, Georgia, later, his father passed away. But this time, Baker pressed

orn in Atlanta, Georgia, Baker was saved in 1976 answering what he describes as a divine summons. "The Lord called me to sing this great Southern Gospel music," he says. "And I've been doing it ever since."

> In 1994, Baker's journey took a painful turn when his mother passed away. "I blamed God," he admits. "I quit singing for a while. I was angry, confused. But then I realized - it wasn't God's fault. It was just her time to go meet the Lord."

> That revelation led to a rebirth. In 1996, Baker launched his solo career, singing in churches and concerts while also promoting Gospel events. "I wanted to encourage people," he says. "To let them know that even in loss, God is still good."

> In 2018, Baker moved to Cedar Bluff, Alabama. A year

deeper into ministry. "I didn't quit," he says. "I sang harder. I praised louder. I knew God was still with me."

In 2024, Baker recorded his first professional project with Chapel Valley, and followed it with another this year. His first single didn't gain much traction, but his second release is climbing the charts. "My latest single, It's Still the Blood, hit #25 on the Christian Voice Magazine Southern Gospel Top 100 for November," Baker shares. "I'm so thankful to the DJs, promoters, and fans. Let's keep pushing it to #1!"

Last year, Baker was named 'Soloist of the Year' by the Georgia Gospel Country & Bluegrass Association. "It was an honor," he says. "But more than

that, it was confirmation. God's not done with me yet."

He's also shared the stage with Gospel greats like The Singing Echoes, The Paynes, and Charles Johnson & The Revivers. In 2024, he performed at the National Quartet Convention Showcase - a milestone moment for the Georgia national stage, Allen Baker remains a vessel of grace and grit. native.

Baker's testimony is simple, yet profound. "First off, I want to thank my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for saving my soul from Hell," he says. "He is my Savior. All thanks go to



Him for everything He's brought me through, all the blessings He's placed in my life."

Now his sixties. Baker in acknowledges the challenges of aging. "Our health starts to fade with age," he says. "But God provides a way, always."

His concerts are more than performances; they're altar calls. "I want people to feel the Spirit in my songs," Baker says. "To know that the life I live is to always follow Jesus."

Baker's mission is clear: to encourage, to uplift, and to lead souls to salvation. "I want to be a friend to everyone I can," he says. "But most of all, I want to help build the Kingdom of God."

His message to listeners is rooted in Proverbs 3:5–6: "Always trust in the Lord with everything you do," he says. "He will guide your steps and give you direction."

Whether singing in a small church or standing on a "I've been through a lot," he says. "But I'm still singing. I'm still praising. And I'm still believing that the best is yet to come."

Refuse to Live with Frustration

he old hymn *Amazing Grace* is a familiar church song for many, but I wonder if we really know how amazing God's grace actually is. It's such a common term in church or other religious settings that we can easily forget the value of grace in our lives.

Ephesians 2:8-9 clearly reveals that we are saved forgiven of our sins and granted eternal life - by grace through faith in Christ. "And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (ESV).

This saving grace is a gift - not something we can earn, purchase, or deserve. That in itself is amazing.

Also, Romans 5:8-10 (NIV) says, "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!"

Think about what these verses are saying. While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. That's amazing! While we were enemies - before we even knew we needed Him or wanted His sacrifice on our behalf - Jesus willingly laid down His life for us so we could be reconciled to God and have a personal relationship with Him.

Notice that verse 9 says "we have now been justified by his blood." This word "justified" means you are made "just as if you've never sinned."

Here's something else I want you to think about: If while you were still an enemy of God - before you cared one iota about Jesus - He sent His Son to die for you, then you can be confident He wants you to become everything He's created you to be. God wants you to experience the amazing life He has planned for you!

And the way you live this life is by grace through faith. God's grace gives us everything we need to live a joy-filled life. Colossians 2:6 says, "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him (NIV).

My personal definition of grace is: God's power made available to us free of charge, enabling us to do with ease what we could never do on our own with any amount of struggle or effort. Learning to live with this power in everything I do has been radically life-changing!

When I first started teaching at conferences, I felt so much pressure to make everything happen the way I thought it should happen. I'd pray so hard and spend so much time getting prepared spiritually and through Bible study that I was practically exhausted before the event even started!

But when I discovered that God doesn't expect me to do it all, and that He is the only one who can change people's hearts, it took all that pressure off of me. I was then free from the frustration of trying to accomplish something that I couldn't do anyway and able to relax and enjoy doing my part of the process.

I do work hard, studying and preparing myself for each conference, but now I enjoy it because I realize what my responsibility is and what I must trust God to do. Philippians 4:13 says, "I can do all things [which He has called me to do] through Him who strengthens and empowers me [to fulfill His purpose...]" (AMP).

God is not just *with* us, but *in* us, and He will do *through* us what needs to be done when we stop trying to do it ourselves and let Him work. AMAZING!

Experiencing the grace of God comes as we learn how to stay plugged in to our power source - our personal relationship with Him. "Plugging in" means we feed our spirit and soul by studying God's Word and spending time with Him in prayer.

It's critical for us to draw from the strength we have in Christ to live by God's grace every single day of our lives.


When you feel weak, don't let anything keep you from plugging in. Take a moment to pray, asking God for His strength. And remember to keep your focus on God's Word and His many promises to provide everything you need, when you need it.

You don't have to live with frustration. Stop trying to succeed in your own effort and start trusting God for His grace in every area of your life. He knows what you need and what needs to change. And you can never ask for too much grace; it has no limit, so it will never run out!



A Solo Voice with a Legacy of Faith

Gospel soloist Dillard Hudgins steps into a new season of ministry with bold songs, deep roots, and a heart to uplift. His latest project, "A Little Bit of This and A Little Bit of That," reflects a lifetime of faith, music, and mission.

or Dillard Hudgins, Gospel music isn't just a genre - it's a calling. The Carnesville, Georgia-based soloist has spent decades singing, serving, and sowing into the lives of others. But in the past year, he's stepped into a new chapter: a solo ministry marked by bold songs, heartfelt testimony, and a renewed sense of purpose.

"I've always sang with someone," Hudgins shares. "But last year, the Lord made it clear - it was time to go solo. It's been challenging, but it's also been one of the most rewarding seasons of my life."

Hudgins' musical journey began early, strumming a guitar and harmonizing with family in the foothills of Georgia. "We did mostly Country and Bluegrass back then," he recalls. "Artists like Lester Flatt and Earl Scruggs, Ernest Tubb, and Porter Wagoner shaped my sound."

At eighteen, his father formed a Gospel group, and Dillard's path shifted. "That's when Gospel music took hold of me," he says. "Groups like The Singing Cookes, the Florida Boys, and the Happy Goodmans became my mentors from afar."

Over the years, he's drawn inspiration from legends like Quinton Mills, Gerald Sweatman, and The Inspirations. "I've been blessed to meet many who've poured into me," Hudgins says. "Their encouragement helped me stay the course."

Beyond the stage, Hudgins has served faithfully in his local church. He was choir director at Harmony Street Baptist for several years and, alongside his wife Linda, has promoted Gospel concerts for over two decades.

"Linda and I have always believed in supporting the music we love," he says. "We've brought artists to our community, helped organize events, and done our part to keep Gospel music alive."

One of the most significant undertakings of his life was building the Refuge Baptist Camp for children. "The Lord impressed it on my heart during a camping trip at Bald Mountain," Hudgins remembers. "The Bradys were singing *Here I Am*, and God spoke to me. From that moment, everything changed."

With help from family and friends, the camp was built and operated from 2005 to 2020. "It was hard work," he

admits, "but it was worth every minute. We also ran the Foothills Gospel Music Park from the same location. It became a place of ministry, music, and memories."

Keeping a group together proved difficult over the years, leading Hudgins to embrace solo ministry. "It was the hardest part, trying to keep everyone on the same page," he says. "But God had a different plan."

That shift has already borne fruit. Hudgins was recently honored with the 'Male Soloist of the Year' award, adding to a list that includes 'Duet of the Year' (with Linda as Southern Bound) and the Living Legend Award.

His current radio single, I Know Who Holds Tomorrow, is a testament to his enduring faith. "That song reminds me - and hopefully others - that no matter what we face, God's got it," he says.

But it's his upcoming project, "A Little Bit of This and A Little Bit of That," that's stirring excitement. The lead single, Jesus For Jim Beam, is already turning heads. "It's a bold title," Hudgins laughs, "but it's a real message. People are searching for something to fill the void. Only Jesus can do that."

Hudgins was saved at age 13, but like many, he experienced seasons of struggle. "I slipped for a while," he admits. "But God brought me back. For the last 25 years, I've been right where He wants me to be."

That journey fuels his ministry. "When I sing, my goal is simple: to uplift and encourage," he says. "I want people to know that being a Christian is the greatest thing they can be, and yes, you can have fun being one."

His concerts are filled with joy, laughter, and deep spiritual moments. "I don't want to just entertain," Hudgins lighter, stronger, and closer to the Lord."

As he prepares to release his new album, Hudgins is focused on staying faithful. "I'm not chasing charts or applause," he says. "I'm chasing obedience. If one person is touched by a song, it's worth it."

He continues to travel, sing, and serve, often with Linda by his side. "She's been my rock," he says. "We've done this together, and I'm grateful for every mile."

For Dillard Hudgins, the road ahead is paved with says. "I want to minister. I want people to leave feeling purpose. "I may be solo now," he says, "but I'm never alone. The Lord is with me, and I'm going full steam ahead."




















Remembering...

DAVID LEE HOUSE

January 10, 1946 - September 9,, 2025

avid House's legacy echoes through every chord he strummed, every soul he touched, and every story he told. His life was a Gospel in motion faithful, fearless, and full of grace.

David Lee House wasn't just a Country Gospel singer - he was a vessel of truth wrapped in melody. Born on January 10, 1946, in Whitesboro, Texas, David's music was never about performance, it was about presence. Whether singing in a church pew, a prison yard, or a remote African village, his voice carried the same message: Jesus saves, and grace is real.


He was honored as the ICGMA 'Male Vocalist of the Year' in 2022, a recognition that barely scratched the surface of his impact. His songs weren't just sung, they were lived. They bore the fingerprints of a man who walked with the broken, wept with the weary, and rejoiced with the redeemed.

David's guitar wasn't just an instrument, it was a pulpit. Through it, he preached sermons of mercy and hope. His songwriting blended humor, humility, and holiness, drawing listeners into stories that felt like home. He was a gifted storyteller, known for weaving laughter into lament and turning everyday moments into eternal truths.

David's ministry was as expansive as his heart. He served faithfully in the KAIROS Prison Ministry, bringing light into the darkest places. In February 1997, fellow minister William Ketchem recalled David's presence in the prison as "a touch of heaven in a place that desperately needed it".

His evangelistic reach extended to Africa, where he shared the Gospel in villages untouched by modernity but deeply moved by his authenticity. He didn't just preach, he listened, loved, and lingered.

Married to Barbara House for 61 years, David was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. His family was his first congregation, and his home was a sanctuary of joy and reverence. He leaves behind a legacy not only of music but of generational faithfulness.



Ross Sims, representing New Horizon Walk #48, posted a tribute shortly after David's passing, honoring his role in spiritual formation and community outreach.

He was described as a man whose "passion for life and unwavering faith touched the hearts of many, creating lasting memories that will be cherished by all who knew him".

David Lee House passed into glory on September 9, 2025. His funeral was held at Grace Church of Ovilla on September 16, where friends and family gathered not to mourn a loss, but to celebrate a life poured out for the Gospel.

His story doesn't end - it multiplies. In every prison chapel, every African village, every living room where his music plays, David's legacy lives on. He was a watchman, a worshiper, and a witness. And now, he sings in the presence of the One he loved most.

By all earthly measures, Charlie Kirk was born into ordinary circumstances. But his life - and death - would prove anything but.

Born October 14, 1993, in Arlington Heights, Illinois, and raised in the nearby suburb of Prospect Heights, Kirk grew up in a middle-class evangelical household that prized faith, family, and country. His father, Robert Kirk, was a project architect involved in the construction of Trump Tower in New York - a symbolic connection that would later echo through Charlie's political journey. His mother, Stephanie, was a homemaker who instilled in him reverence for Scripture and a fierce independence of thought.

Charlie's intellectual fire was evident early. At Wheeling attack on our entire nation," declaring, "The g High School, he challenged teachers and classmates alike, at him, but the bullet was aimed at all of us". often quoting conservative radio legend Rush

Limbaugh. "Rush taught me that ideas matter more than credentials," Charlie once said. That revelation would shape his destiny.

After a brief stint at Harper College, Charlie dropped out, disillusioned by what he saw as the ideological conformity of higher education. He believed his calling lay not in academia but in activism. "College was a place where I felt punished for thinking differently," he wrote in his first book. At just 18, he founded Turning Point USA (TPUSA), a nonprofit aimed at countering liberal narratives on college campuses. With seed funding from donors like Foster Friess and support from the Koch network, TPUSA grew into a juggernaut of youth mobilization.

Kirk's signature "Prove Me Wrong" campus debates became viral spectacles. He challenged students on issues ranging from socialism to gender identity, often sparking heated exchanges. These moments, captured on social media, catapulted him into the national spotlight. By 2016, he was the youngest speaker at the Republican National

Convention. Though initially skeptical of Donald Trump, Kirk became one of the president's most loyal allies. "Trump gave voice to the forgotten American," Kirk declared in a 2018 interview.

His ideology fused traditional conservatism with Christian nationalism and Trumpism. He opposed abortion, gun control, diversity programs, and the LGBTQ agenda. His influences included Rush Limbaugh, William F. Buckley Jr., Donald Trump, and Rob McCoy - a Pentecostal pastor who co-founded Turning Point Faith with Charlie, aligning him with the Christian right.

In 2021, Charlie married Erika Frantzve, a Christian podcaster and former Miss Arizona USA. The couple had two children - a daughter and a son. Erika often appeared alongside Charlie at faith-based events, and their marriage was portrayed as a model of Christian partnership. Despite his public persona, Charlie was intensely private. Friends described him as "obsessively driven," "deeply spiritual," and "unapologetically American."

Then came the moment that changed everything.

On September 10, 2025, Charlie Kirk was fatally shot in the neck while speaking at Utah Valley University during his "American Comeback Tour." The event was meant to be a spirited debate forum, but it ended in tragedy when a 22-year-old assailant opened fire from a rooftop approximately 130 meters away. Kirk collapsed mid-sentence. He died on the scene. The shooter, later identified as Tyler James Robinson, was arrested and charged with aggravated murder. The FBI classified the killing as a politically motivated domestic terror incident targeting conservative speech.

President Donald Trump called the assassination "an attack on our entire nation," declaring, "The gun was pointed at him, but the bullet was aimed at all of us".

In the hours following Charlie's death, social media erupted. While many expressed condolences, a disturbing number of left-wing activists and influencers mocked or even celebrated the assassination. Hashtags like #GoodRiddance and #KirkIsGone trended briefly on X (formerly Twitter), prompting outrage from conservatives.

Some liberal commentators justified the killing by citing Charlie's views on race, gender, and COVID-19. Others posted memes and jokes, which many saw as inhumane and emblematic of a growing cultural divide.

In the Christian right. "This is evil masquerading as progress," said Vice In 2021, Charlie married Erika Frantzve, a Christian President JD Vance. "When you celebrate death, you've lost caster and former Miss Arizona USA. The couple had two your soul."

Charlie's assassination was not an isolated incident. In the weeks that followed, conservative churches, student groups, and speakers reported a surge in threats and attacks. TPUSA chapters in Portland, Berkeley, and Minneapolis were vandalized. A pastor in Ohio was hospitalized after being assaulted during a pro-life rally.

The Department of Homeland Security issued a bulletin warning of increased political violence targeting Christian and conservative groups. Erika Kirk, now CEO of TPUSA, called for "peaceful resistance and spiritual warfare."

But from the ashes of tragedy rose something extraordinary.

On September 21, 2025, tens of thousands gathered at State Farm Stadium in Glendale, Arizona, for Charlie Kirk's memorial service. The event was a fusion of political tribute and spiritual awakening. President Trump called Kirk "a martyr for American freedom" and announced he would posthumously award him the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Vice President JD Vance escorted Kirk's casket aboard Air Force Two and declared him "a hero to the United States and a martyr for the Christian faith." Erika Kirk, in a tearful speech, forgave her husband's killer and said, "Evil thought there'd be a funeral today. God created a revival."

The service began with hours of worship music. Hillsong, Elevation Worship, and Bethel Music led thousands in praise. Attendees raised their hands, wept, and prayed. According to TPUSA, over 120,000 new chapter inquiries were received in the days following the memorial. Most astonishingly, over 18,000 people reportedly gave their lives to Christ during the service. Baptisms were held in makeshift pools outside the stadium. Pastors from across the country described it as "the largest spontaneous revival since the Jesus Movement."

Charlie Kirk's death did not silence his message - it amplified it. His core beliefs, once controversial, became rallying cries for a movement that saw him as a martyr. His speeches, books, and viral videos were replayed across churches, campuses, and conservative media outlets. Turning "Kirk Doctrine" - a blend of Christian nationalism, anti-

Point USA launched the Charlie Kirk Institute for American Renewal, a think tank focused on faith-based governance, constitutional originalism, and youth mobilization. The institute's motto: "Truth over tolerance."

The memorial service in Arizona was just the beginning. What followed was a wave of revival meetings across the country: In Dallas, over 10,000 gathered for a "Faith and Freedom" rally where hundreds were baptized. In Nashville, churches reported record attendance and spontaneous altar calls. In Boise, a youth-led prayer vigil turned into a three-day worship event that drew national media attention. Pastor Rob McCoy, Kirk's spiritual mentor, said: "Charlie's death was the seed. The harvest is here." Thousands of young people joined TPUSA Faith, a new branch focused on church engagement and biblical literacy. The phrase "I found Jesus at Charlie's memorial" became a viral hashtag.

Kirk's final book, "The War on Truth," released posthumously, became a bestseller. It warned of rising authoritarianism from the left and called for a "spiritual awakening rooted in biblical truth and American grit."

Charlie Kirk's assassination didn't just spark mourning it ignited a cultural reckoning. Across America, conservatives and Christians began reexamining their place in a society increasingly hostile to their values. Kirk's death became a symbol of the cost of conviction.

Churches reported a surge in attendance. Youth ministries exploded in size. Political engagement among Gen Z conservatives skyrocketed. The phrase "Live like Charlie" became a mantra for bold, unapologetic faith.

In liberal circles, the backlash to the celebration of Kirk's death prompted soul-searching. A few progressive voices broke ranks to condemn the cruelty. "We've lost our humanity," wrote one columnist. "Disagreement should never mean dehumanization."

Internationally, Kirk's assassination sparked protests and vigils in London, Warsaw, and São Paulo. Evangelical leaders in Brazil and Poland cited Kirk as a "prophet silenced by secularism." In Israel, conservative Knesset members held a moment of silence in his honor. The Vatican issued a statement condemning political violence and praising Kirk's "unwavering commitment to life and liberty." Even critics acknowledged his influence. A liberal columnist wrote, "You may not have liked Charlie Kirk, but you couldn't ignore him."

Kirk's absence created a vacuum - but also a platform. A new generation of leaders stepped forward. Erika Frantzve Kirk became CEO of TPUSA and host of the "Faith Forward" podcast. Her blend of grace and grit drew comparisons to Margaret Thatcher and Esther. She launched the Charlie Kirk Legacy Tour, drawing tens of thousands to stadiums across the country. Pastor Rob McCoy expanded TPUSA Faith into 1,200 churches nationwide. His sermon, often titled "The Mantle Has Fallen," called believers to spiritual warfare and civic engagement.

The 2026 midterms were reshaped by Kirk's death. Candidates endorsed by TPUSA surged in popularity. The globalism, and youth mobilization became a litmus test for conservative authenticity. In Congress, the Charlie Kirk Act was introduced to protect political speech on campuses and increase security for public speakers. It passed with bipartisan support, a rare moment of unity.

On September 19, 2025, both the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives passed a resolution declaring October 14 as the National Day of Remembrance for Charlie Kirk. The resolution encourages citizens, schools, and civic organizations to observe the day annually. The date was chosen to honor Kirk's birthday rather than the day of his assassination, shifting the focus toward celebrating his life and influence.

Kirk's death became a catalyst for revival. Thousands who had never heard of him found Christ through his story. His memorial service is now studied in seminaries as a case study in modern evangelism.

Charlie Kirk was not universally loved. He was divisive, provocative, and unyielding. But he was also courageous, principled, and deeply committed to his faith and country.

His death exposed the fault lines in American culture - but also revealed the hunger for truth, revival, and redemption.

He once said, "If I die for this cause, let it be known - I died free." And now, in death, Charlie Kirk lives on in the hearts of millions who refuse to bow, who choose faith over fear, and who carry the torch he lit.

Jack Smith's Work Exposes America's Actual Threat, says Bauer

A conservative activist savs the "incredible" revelation that the former president weaponized the FBI against his political opponent raises "grave anxieties."

The special counsel is supposedly structured to be independent. Jack Smith, who was appointed to the position by former Attorney General Merrick Garland, is described as a registered independent. but his wife's donation to Joe Biden's 2020 presidential campaign has been perceived as a reflection of his bias.

The career prosecutor was specifically appointed to Joe Biden's Department of Justice in 2022 to oversee two major investigations into President Donald Trump: the retention and concealment of classified documents after he left office and his efforts to "overturn" the 2020 election.

FBI Director Kash Patel recently revealed that Smith used the Washington Field Office's public corruption unit to investigate Trump. His "Arctic Frost" team also used the bureau to track Republican senators' private conversations.

Democrats and their allies in the media have long claimed the president is "a threat to our democracy," but Gary Bauer of the Campaign for Working Families contends the real threat to our constitutional republic is "not from the Right; it's from the Left."

monitoring Republican senators' phones and their location and so forth is really

incredible, and it's certainly the sort of thing that raises grave anxieties," he states.

Bauer recalls witnessing the Left's efforts to put Donald Trump in jail for life. "[There's] a concerted pattern of the political Left in this country acting not like neo-Marxists but like Marxists in an attempt to destroy their political opponents," he summarizes.

Director Patel has terminated the agents who worked on Smith's probe, dismantled the weaponized CR-15 squad, and initiated an ongoing investigation with more accountability measures ahead.

"We are cleaning up a diseased temple three decades in the making - identifying the rot, removing those who weaponized law enforcement for political purposes and those who do not meet the standards of this mission while restoring integrity to the FBI," Patel

said in a statement to Fox News Digital. "I promised reform, and I intend to deliver it."

"This is serious stuff," Bauer asserts. "It explains why there's so much screeching going on as President Trump's Department of Justice and FBI begin to delve in to what was happening to the American people in the four years before Donald Trump returned to office."

Advice Offered as Unconstitutional Compelled Speech is Catching On

University of California San Diego is subjecting students to mandatory training that teaches "dead naming," or refusing to call a "transgender" student by his or her preferred name, is "prohibited conduct," that requiring their peers to use bathrooms that align with their biological sex may be "sexual harassment," and that disagreeing with transgender ideology creates a "hostile environment."

The College Fix notes that Assembly Bill No. 2683 requires all California state community colleges and public universities to conduct trainings on sexual violence and harassment.

"Our representatives are mandating to college students that they believe one way about sexuality and gender," says Greg Burt of the California Family Council. "They are now requiring students to take a test every year saying that they will not sexually harass anyone, and that includes that they will not complain that males are in females' bathrooms."

At UC San Diego, students who do not complete the training and score 100% on the quiz that follows will be placed on academic hold that prevents them from registering for future courses.

Burt says it boils down to students are required to say things they do not believe. "It's compelled speech, and compelled speech by the government is a violation of free speech," he tells AFN. "The government cannot require us to say the things they want us to say on any topic in particular."

He predicts lawsuits will be filed, and as this kind of thing is happening elsewhere and in other professions, Burt







encourages anyone who encounters something like this to resist, to "commit themselves not to go along to get along."

People of faith should insist that the First Amendment applies to them and ask for a religious accommodation, and the institution requiring training like UC's "Sexual Violence and Harassment, Anti-Discrimination, Prevention and Education" should be willing to provide it.

"The only way this is going to stop is people have to resist," Burt reiterates.

'State-Sponsored Kidnapping' Puts Parental Rights in the Spotlight

A state senator says it's "egregious" that Oklahoma's DHS removed a 17-year-old cancer patient from his home.

The Canadian County boy's mother, who is fighting to regain custody, wanted to stop chemotherapy treatments at OU Children's Hospital last year and go instead with natural cancer treatments. According to local news outlets, a family member called a hotline and falsely accused the mother of medical neglect. DHS was granted emergency custody, and the teen was given a blood transfusion and began chemotherapy again without the mother's consent.

Oklahoma State Senator Shane Jett (R-District 17) thinks "every parent should be concerned" about the precedent being set here; the government is taking a child and forcing medical treatment against his parent's wishes and without the parent's consent.

Jett's office is in talks with the governor's office about this situation, as the Department of Human Services (DHS) is part of the executive branch.

The state senator also denounces the financial incentives the doctor and other healthcare providers in this situation enjoy.

"That doctor gets paid for these clients that come through," he notes. "Whenever they sell each treatment of chemo, it's \$17,000 per treatment. They get paid even if the family is not affluent or if they are indigent." DHS, he adds, also gets money for "every child they put into custody."

He calls this a case of "state-sponsored kidnapping." "We're not talking about neglect," says Jett. "This isn't a kid that was in a cage, in squalor and dying of malnutrition. This is a kid in an incredibly engaged and loving home, and this kid was mowing the lawn with his stepdad two Saturdays ago whenever DHS showed up and wanted to have proof of life."

He goes on to encourage voters to reach out to and urge House and Senate members to pass robust parental rights protection so that this does not happen again.

"Also, we need to end this anonymous hotline mess where you can call in and lie about parents," Jett adds.

Cartels Put Out Bounties on ICE agents, Trump Admin Investigates

An immigration attorney says drug cartel members need to face stiff criminal penalties for putting bounties on federal Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents.

Department of Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem has revealed that cartels, gangs, and terror groups have put bounties on several federal immigration agents, offering \$10,000 to kill them and \$2,000 for their capture, reports the New York Post.

Related to that issue, President Donald Trump signed an executive order in January that allowed for a process in designating certain international cartels as Foreign Terrorist Organizations or Specially Designated Global Terrorists.

In the article from the New York Post, Noem told Fox News that specific agents have been targeted as their pictures have been released and sent between their networks. She calls it an extremely dangerous and unprecedented situation.

According to her, the Trump administration believes that some of these aggressors are organized. Noem says they are trying to find the people who fund these riots against law enforcement in cities like Chicago, as they all appear to have the same equipment.

Noem even posted on X late September: "Comparing ICE day-in and day-out to the Nazi Gestapo, and the Secret Police, and slave patrols has consequences... The Violence and dehumanization of these men and women who are simply enforcing the law must stop."

Art Arthur is a resident fellow in law and policy at the Center for Immigration Studies. He says there are stiff penalties for these kinds of threats.

"Conspiracy to target a federal officer is a federal crime and one that carries felony penalties with itself. Kash Patel and the FBI needs to get to the bottom of whether there are bounties being placed on the heads of our ICE officers and who's doing it, then go after them and give them some very stiff jail sentences," states Arthur.

He stresses that this in the only way that these threats will be resolved. He also says it is time to dial back the rhetoric.

"Immigration enforcement is a necessary part of our federal framework. The American people get to decide who comes in, who has to leave, and how long they can stay. And they've spoken through the Immigration and Nationality Act. ICE isn't doing anything that congress hasn't told it to do and so the time has come that ice be allowed to actually do it job."




BUT GOD!

The Unshakable Journey of Jennifer Phillips

From the ashes of unimaginable loss and the depths of despair, Jennifer Phillips has emerged with a voice stronger than ever one that carries the weight of testimony and the fire of revival. Here's a glimpse into the extraordinary journey through grief, healing, and the unwavering call of ministry that continues to echo with power, purpose, and prophetic clarity.

"I launched my solo ministry in 2006," Jen recalls. "But on March 23, 2008, God allowed me to meet Angie Phillips at Cornerstone Church! The connection was instant... she was my un-biological sister and my best friend!!" Their bond, rooted in shared adoption stories and spiritual hunger, became a force for the Kingdom. They wrote songs, prayed fervently, and ministered side-by-side.

In 2012, Angie joined The Grissops as soprano, while her husband Scott took on sound and travel duties. The trio ministered 75-80 dates a year as "weekend warriors," witnessing salvations, healings, and lives transformed.

When Jen married Ted Brady in 2018, the ministry became The Bradys. But 2019 brought a storm: Jen lost her job of 15 years, and her father, unsaved, died of a heart attack. Still, they stepped out in faith. "With less than \$500 in the bank," Jen shares, "we trusted God! A man crawled to the altar and walked back to his seat. He left his wheelchair at the

Then came 2020. COVID canceled every date. Ted and Jen accepted worship roles at Destination Church, and Angie joined the praise team. But on September 9, COVID hit their home. Ted fought for life. Jen stood on Isaiah 53:5. "On September 28, Ted was promoted to heaven. I was a widow at 37."

That night, grief nearly consumed her. "I poured all the pills into my hand... and my phone rang. It was Angie. 'DON'T LIE TO ME, Jennifer Brady! GOD HAS ALREADY SHOWED ME!! FLUSH THOSE PILLS DOWN THE TOILET!' They loved me more than they feared COVID."

Their final trio performance was November 1. Days later, Angie was hospitalized with COVID. She fought for weeks, was discharged, then collapsed. On December 15, 2020, Angie passed away. "I wrote her obituary... I sang at her funeral... but a part of me died when she did."

Jen's next chapter was darker still. She married a conartist who planned to take her life for insurance. He died of COVID complications. "A fraud... but GOD!"

Broken and abused, Jen reached out to Scott. He and his children took her in. "Jennifer had ministry appointments," Scott shares. "I prayed, talked to our families, and followed my heart." He asked Jen if he could love her forever like Christ loves the church. She said yes.

"Strong, steady, supportive and sincere," Jen says. "Scott stood by me when I had no words left to say."

Together, they now have seven children through adoption. Their April wedding ceremony included a Unity Sand celebration, merging families, ministries, and hearts.

Jen continued ministering, but grief and Fibromyalgia drained her. "Every service was anointed," she says, "but I'd spend 3-5 days in bed afterward." She recorded two albums in 2023 but never released them.

Then came March 29, 2025. At an SGH Music Group event in

Clinton, Tennessee, Jen was healed. "At 10:15 pm, God healed my body! He sparked that desire to minister again. I'm the voice that once cried out in brokenness now sings with more excited about ministry TODAY than I've been in 5 years!"



With John Lanier on bass and drums, Tara Byers on harmony vocals, and April Lanier at the ministry table, But GOD Ministries is rising again. Their first radio single, Holy Ghost Conviction, debuted at #99 on the CVM Country Gospel Chart in June and climbed to #57 by September.

"These are the last days," Jen declares. "We have no time to play church. God is still moving, and 'Holy Ghost Conviction' is still drawing sinners to salvation!"

From ashes to anointing, Jennifer Phillips' journey is a living testimony: But GOD. When grief whispered death, God spoke life. When betrayal threatened purpose, God restored it. And when pain lingered too long, God healed it.

The ministry continues - not on tracks, but in truth. And prophetic clarity in a culture of confusion.

Chicken Casserole I

3 whole Chicken Breasts 1 stick Butter or Margarine 2/3 cup Milk 1 can Cream of Chicken 1 can Cream of Celery 1 package Seasoned Dry Stuffing 1 ½ cups Chicken Broth

Cook chicken with a little salt and pepper. (Crockpot did great and makes great broth.) De-bone and cut in bite-size pieces. (*You can save some to make gravy.) Place in a 13x9 casserole dish.



Melt butter or margarine and mix with milk and soups. Pour soup mixture over chicken.

Mix stuffing with chicken broth and spoon over soup. Bake for 425° for about 25 minutes.

Serve with homemade cranberry orange sauce.



Cranberry Orange Sauce

1 bag cranberries 1 1/2 cups sugar 3/4 cup water 1 orange

Add cranberries to boiling water, cooking until they all pretty much pop open. Cut up orange. Put orange with peel and cranberries with juice through a food mill into a bowl. You will end up with mostly orange peel and cranberry skins to discard.

Pour the juice/pulp in saucepan with sugar. Slow boil for about 10-12 minutes. Pour into a mold sprayed with Pam. Chill for several hours or overnight.

Go around the edges with plastic knife, lifting at the bottom as you go, but not to tear the molded cranberry sauce. (You can place in a pool of warm water for a few seconds.) Invert on a plate. YUM



Sweet Potato Pie

2 cups sweet potatoes (peeled and cooked)

1 cup sugar

1/2 stick butter (melted)

2 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon ginger

1 cup milk

9" unbaked pie shell

Cool Whip (optional)


Make or purchase pie shell.




